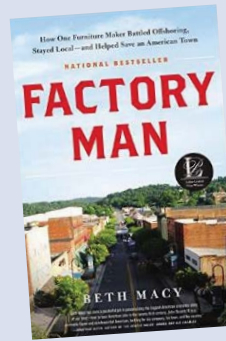
ROTARIAN FOUNDATION DINNER
